In 1992, the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of the University and Scientific and Technological Research, granted the Fondazione Santa Lucia the status of Scientific Institute for Hospitalisation and Treatment of National Importance and High-level Specialisation in Neuromotor Rehabilitation, in recognition of its constant commitment to clinical, research and teaching activities. As a Scientific Institute the Foundation carries out intensive research work in the fields of neuromotor rehabilitation and, more generally, of neuroscience. Under an agreement with the "Tor Vergata" University of Rome, it conducts first-level degree courses for health professions (Nurses, Physiotherapists, Speech and language Therapists, and Neurophysiopathology Technicians), attended by about 400 students a year. The teaching staff consists of university lecturers, graduate staff of the Foundation and high-ranking professionals for the specific degree courses.

The prerequisite to enter the SLT programme is Baccalaureat (13 years formal education). The yearly intake is limited to about 20 students (numerus clauses). Admission is obtained by a competitive exam.

The SLT programme is a full-time study course. Three academic years and 180 ECTS are required to obtain the degree in STL. Each year 40 ECTS are devoted to theoretical studies (principal topics: medicine, cognitive psychology, developmental and acquired speech and language disorders, voice and swallowing disorders) and 20 ECTS to practical training.
