The University of Oslo

is Norway's largest and oldest institution of research and higher education and offers a wide variety of study programs. There are eight faculties at the University with approximately 28.000 students of which 2900 are PhD candidates. The University's official language is Norwegian, but teaching is also provided in English in a number of Bachelor, Master and PhD programmes.

Department of Special Needs Education is one of the three departments at the Faculty of Educational Sciences (UV). The Department offers five MA programs in Special Needs Education of which the program in Speech and Language Therapy is one.

The prerequisites for the SLT program are bachelor degree in Special Needs Education (240 ECTS) or other bachelor degrees that include 90 ECTS of Special Needs Education . *The yearly intake* is 30 - 35 students. The applicants must have attained a grade point average of C or better in their bachelor degree.

The content of the study. The MA-program in SLT is a two year full-time program involving modules in speech and language pathology (language disorders, SLI, aphasia and other acquired language and speech disorders, fluency disorders, swallowing disorders, voice disorders) PBL, counseling and clinical practicum. The program focuses on research as well as professional development. The master's thesis should consist of independent research work with relevance to the field of speech and language therapy.
