Reports from Workpackages 4, 5 and 6

WP 4: Quality assurance of the management and outcomes of the project

According to plan, the NetQues project finished with the final meeting in Ghent in September 2013. Now all partners within the project and everyone interested in the results can have a look at the outcomes of the project on the NetQues web-page. Here, WP4 reports on the last steps of Quality Assurance in the project.

WP4 finalized the work of Quality Assurance with the third and last annual audit report. The lead partners of every WPT completed the self assessment checklist twice in 2013: in January and again in June. Based on these answers the WP4 compiled the annual audit report, which is, after approval by the PMSG, now available on the website together with the two annual audit reports from 2011 and 2012. Additionally, the WP4 developed a self assessment for every partner and compiled an overview of all answers that was sent to the PMSG in June 2013, with some conclusions. Difficulties regarding information and communication processes between partners are to be expected in such a huge pan-European project, but the high percentage of positive answers regarding communication (63.9 % reported no difficulties) shows the project functioned well, to a great extent.

Supporting the review process was the second task of WP4. Because of the very limited time at the end of the main work of the project, and its timing during the academic summer vacation period, the PMSG requested written feedback only from key stakeholders including some selected external experts of international repute. However, all project partners were able to give feedback and comment on the project outcomes in a workshop at the final meeting in September 2013. The results of this discussion are accessible for all partners on the internal part of the website in annex 2 of the minutes. The project outcomes (the executive summary, the project report and the annexes, especially the benchmarks) can now be read and reflected upon against the background of this feedback.

At the end of this inspiring project, WP4 would like to thank everyone for supporting the processes of Quality Assurance, especially the members of the PMSG and the lead partners of the other WPTs.

We are now looking forward to the future use of the results, to contributing to the enhancement of existing and evolving SLT educations across Europe, and to meeting each other again as participants of a great European Network.
